**SUBJECT:** Report on the 2019 USA Boxing Last Chance Qualifier Hosted by the City of Oxnard Police Activities League. (10/10/5)

**RECOMMENDATION**

That the Community Services Committee receive a report on the 2019 USA Boxing Last Chance Qualifier hosted by the City of Oxnard Police Activities League.

**BACKGROUND**

Over the years, the Oxnard Police Activities League ("Oxnard PAL") has been home to 24 boxing competitions with more than 9,500 bouts. These competitions include local shows (2003), State Championships (2004-2008), National Championships (2005-2018), USA Boxing Qualifier (2006), and International Competitions (2005, 2011-2012). These competitions have ranged from a single day to up to six days of competition, and have had as many as 558 boxers in a single event. Oxnard PAL Boxing has earned a name for themselves in amateur boxing for holding safe and well organized competitions with the highest hospitality. Oxnard PAL holds to the belief that the athletes who work hard towards their goals should be rewarded and everyone leaves PAL's competitions with something, even if it is simply a t-shirt to commemorating their hard work.

In 2006, Oxnard PAL launched a website to highlight the best and brightest amateur boxers in the country, and for thirteen years has remained dedicated to carrying out that goal. On the website, families and friends can view a live stream of every professionally recorded bout hosted at Oxnard PAL provided free of charge to their friends and families back home. Over the last three years, the live stream has averaged over 50,000 views every tournament. The website is also used to access tournament information including event bout sheets.

With the long term success of past tournaments hosted by Oxnard PAL, the National Association of Police Athletic/Activities Leagues along with USA Boxing, Inc. have selected the City of Oxnard to host the 2019 Last Chance Qualifier as a component of the annual boxing tournament. With an anticipated registration of over 700 boxers between the ages of 13 to 40 years old, this event will serve as the final opportunity for amateur boxers to earn a spot on the United States Boxing Team in hopes of competing in the Summer Olympic Games in Tokyo, Japan.

The event will be held from November 2 through November 9, 2019 and will include a volunteer appreciation reception (location to be determined). The tournament will also bring past Olympians, and many supporters, to

Oxnard as they attend to support their fellow athletes. With seating capacity of approximately 1,100 and streamed online to 40,000-60,000 viewers, this event is sure to bring a lot of visitors to, and recognition of, Oxnard.

### **Oxnard PAL Facility - 350 South K Street**

The Oxnard PAL facility was originally built in 1952 and is in need of many upgrades and repairs. A portion of this facility is used to house Cultural and Community Service employees that support over 35 programs. The gymnasium, where the Last Chance Qualifier will take place, is programmed daily for recreation opportunities including athletics, mentoring, leadership, homework help, arts & Crafts, table games, and dance classes. The adjacent classroom spaces are also used, be it to a lesser extent, for community, recreation, and non-profit services. The City Council previously approved the Phase I improvements to the south wing, including demolishing old walls replacing the roof, and installing new windows. As part of the 2019 - 2024 Capital Improvement Program City Council approved Phase II improvements of the north wing which will include finishing the interior construction (walls, doors, windows, electrical wiring, replace exterior doors).

Prior to the November 2019 Last Chance Qualifier high-speed fiber optic lines will be installed for internet to the PAL location. This will allow the events to be live streamed on USA Boxing, National PAL, and Oxnard PAL websites. This will also benefit the existing program by providing internet access to youth within the mentoring, leadership, and homework help programs to complete projects, in addition to staff daily operations. In addition, the changing rooms in the south locker rooms will be upgraded and temporary showers brought in for the event. These improvements will also benefit the existing programming at the facility. Lastly, minor cosmetic improvements such as replacing plexiglass trophy cases and repainting within the gymnasium will take place before the event.

## **STRATEGIC PRIORITIES**

This agenda item supports the Quality of Life strategy. The purpose of the Quality of Life strategy is to build relationships and create opportunities within the community for safe and vibrant neighborhoods, which will showcase the promising future of Oxnard. This item supports the following goals and objectives:

Goal 1. Improve community safety and quality of life through a combination of prevention, intervention, and suppression efforts that address crime and underlying issues.

Objective 1b. Explore alternatives for youth through recreation programs and intervention services.

## **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

There is not a budget appropriation associated with this report. The high-speed fiber optic lines, estimated to cost \$35,000, are funded through previously awarded Housing and Community Development grant funding. The other minor renovations, estimated to cost \$4,000 are incorporated in the Recreation and Community Services. The Phase II project is funded through HERO bond proceeds and were approved as part of the 2019-2024 Capital Improvement Program.
