I. CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS/COMMITTEE REPORTS

The members of the Council provided brief announcements regarding various activities.

Councilmember Perello requested an agenda item to discuss the offshore and gas leasing off the Central Coast.

Councilman Starr requested an agenda item regarding the ordinance to eliminate the unlawful IUF charge on solid waste rates and have a discussion about the refund. The City Attorney advised against an open session discussion regarding the refund of the IUF fees. This is a subject of ongoing litigation and it would be against the City's interests for Councilmembers to provide opinions that may contradict applicable law. To the extent there is discussion in open session notwithstanding this advice, that discussion would subvert the City's litigation interests.

1. City Clerk Department

SUBJECT: Selection of Mayor Pro Tem.

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council, pursuant to Government Code sections 34905 and 36801:

1. Select one of two common methods to select a Mayor Pro Tem; and
2. Select a Mayor Pro Tem to serve in the event of the Mayor's absence.

Public comments were received from Angela Whitecomb, Ronald Arruejo, Greg Runyon, Manuel Herrera, Barbara Macri-Ortiz, Larry Stein, Sara Wilczewski and caller ending 4716.

Written comments were received from Steven Nash and Deirdre Frank.

It was moved by Mayor Mc Arthur, seconded by Councilwoman Perez to appoint Gabe Teran as Mayor Pro Tem for an additional one-year term.

Councilman Starr made an amendment by substitute motion, seconded by Councilman Perello, to open nominations and hold an election among the council to fill the Mayor Pro Tem position.

Debate followed.

VOTE on Starr amendment: Perello, Rodriguez, Starr, Basua, Teran, and Mc Arthur voted in favor. Councilwoman Perez voted no. The Starr amendment carried 6-1, thus it became the main motion.

VOTE on main motion: Perez, Rodriguez, Starr, Basua, Teran, Perello, and Mc Arthur voted in favor. The motion carried 7-0.

Nominations were opened for Mayor Pro Tem. Councilmember Perello nominated Gabe Teran, and Councilman Starr nominated Gabriela Rodriguez. There being no further nominations, Mayor Mc Arthur closed nominations. Following discussion on the method of voting, Mayor Mc Arthur without objection called for a voice vote.

Votes in favor of Gabe Teran: Basua, Teran, Perello, Perez, and Mc Arthur.

Votes in favor of Gabriela Rodriguez: Starr and Rodriguez.

The City Clerk announced that Gabe Teran received five votes and Gabriela Rodriguez received two votes. Gabe Teran was elected as Mayor Pro Tem for an additional one-year term.

He announced some minor typos on page 474 and 475, the footer should read "Eighth Amendment and not First Amendment"; also, on the first page of the agreement, it should read "VRSD instead of CRSD" and on the third line of the first paragraph, the word groundwater was left out, so it should read "related to landfill gas monitoring and groundwater monitoring and reporting."


