BACKGROUND

As the current City’s Five-Year Priorities expire, it is time for the City Council to update/refresh Oxnard’s priorities for the next five-year period. There are five major categories, with five priorities each. The major categories are as follows (the items in each are discussed below):

- Economic Development
- Quality of Life
- Public Safety
- Infrastructure and Natural Resources
- Organizational Effectiveness

DISCUSSION

The City Council’s Five-Year Priorities align public policy with community needs, inform budgeting, and provide the administration with a clear roadmap.

Priority setting is about just that, the selection of priorities. There are many urgent needs. There are many important issues. And there are many, many wants and desires from the public. As the policy makers, the City Council must weigh all of these, balance the competing interests, make rational and fair deliberations, and ultimately choose the priorities in order to set clear public policy direction for the administration.

The easy part, if there is one, is that as a city, we are only responsible for providing municipal services. And in our case, we are a full-service city providing a full array of municipal services. We do not, for example, provide public education, health care, mental health care, social work, airport services, transit services, commercial harbor services, or highway maintenance – those are the responsibility of separate government entities.

The city’s responsibilities are captured within our five broad categories below. These categories paint clearly the four corners of a California municipal government’s primary duties, our purpose. Staff would not recommend, for example, that the City Council seek to establish a municipal ostrich farm!

Also, setting five-year priorities is not about the upcoming budget, or any singular budget. It is, again, about providing a public policy document that reflects the community as a whole and provides a clear roadmap for the administration.

The current priorities set by the City Council are as follows:

Economic Development

1. Focus on business retention and expansion and new business attraction
2. Train and prepare residents for employment at local businesses through the Oxnard Employee Pipeline
3. Revitalize Hueneme/Saviers/Pleasant Valley/Channel Islands corridor
4. Renovate 4th St. between Downtown and train station to create a safe connection between the transit center and downtown
5. Create a new Zócalo in South Oxnard

Quality of Life

1. Restore and enhance youth programs and launch the Oxnard Arts Academy for local youth in South Oxnard
2. Restore and enhance senior programs and build the Council-approved new Senior Center
3. Continue to address homelessness in Oxnard
4. Build an Aquatics Center in South Oxnard
5. Create process to study PACC and reopen the Carnegie Art Museum

Public Safety

1. Maintain 911 emergency response times
2. Maintain fire protection services
3. Restore Neighborhood Police program
4. Restore and possibly increase paramedic squads
5. Create a modern disaster preparedness program to prepare the City for response and recovery from earthquakes, flooding and other disasters
 - * *Modest and incremental implementation of security cameras; data-driven by OPD*
 - * *Modest and incremental implementation of lifeguard program*

Infrastructure and Natural Resources

1. Restore proper street paving cycle
2. Restore proper maintenance of parkways and medians, tree trimming cycle, and clean up the gateways to the City
3. Ensure adequate future water supply
4. Repair alleys
5. Repair seawalls

Organizational Effectiveness

1. Secure long-term financial sustainability
2. Replenish the City's financial reserves and establish sufficient reserves to respond to disasters such as earthquakes and floods
3. Invest in appropriate staffing levels to get the job done
4. Strengthen the City's cybersecurity
5. Invest in staff training and development

For the next five years, a good starting place would be to pick up from where we are today.

- Complete initial seawall repairs and continue long-term planning for the remainder

Organizational Effectiveness

- Maintain long-term financial sustainability
- Maintain the City's financial reserves and establish sufficient reserves to respond to disasters such as earthquakes and floods
- Invest in appropriate staffing levels to get the job done
- Strengthen the City's cybersecurity
- Invest in staff training and development

The above is the recommended starting point.

The Measure 'O' expiration factor – The voter-approved Measure 'O' half-penny sales tax is scheduled to expire at the beginning of 2029, which will represent an approximately \$21M reduction in general fund revenue. While we have done a good job of planning for this in the prior five years, we did not know to plan for the new Costco being built in Camarillo, the state-wide efforts that could eventually take away up to 50% of the sales tax we get from the Amazon warehouse in our city, the funding cuts from the federal and state governments, various unfunded state mandates, or the

extreme turbulence of the economy occurring now. With this in mind, we ask that the Council takes these issues into account and to have realistic and feasible goals when selecting priorities for the next five years.

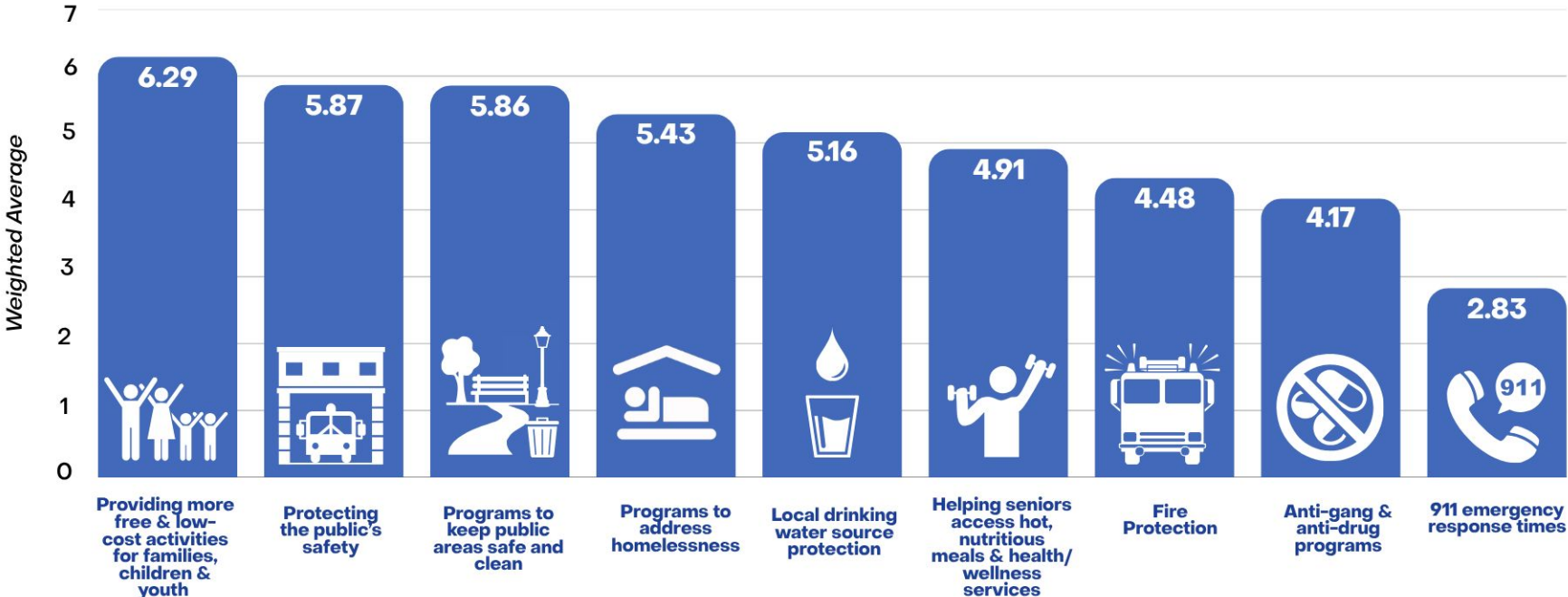

Snapshot of the Top 10 most referenced topics under “Suggestions for Additional Service Priorities”



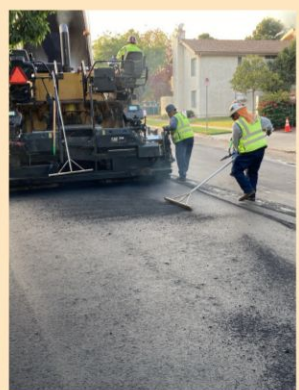

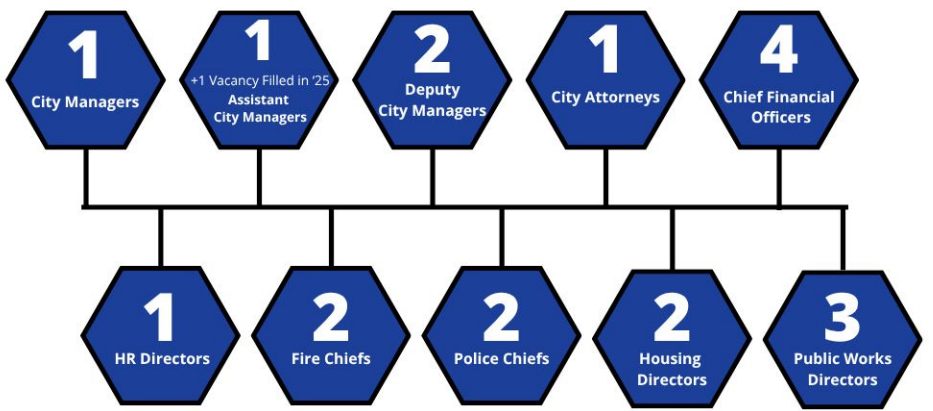

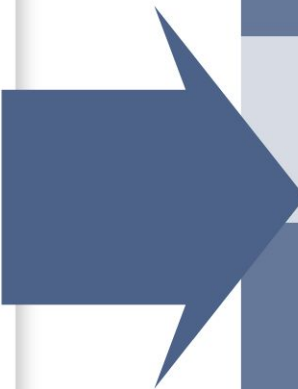

SUBJECT: Agreement with CDW/Microsoft.

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council approve and authorize the Mayor to execute an agreement with CDW Corporation (Agreement No. 32600479), in an amount not-to-exceed \$1.5 million for the purchase of Microsoft licenses over a three-year term from May 1, 2026, to April 30, 2029.

BACKGROUND

Since 2011, the City of Oxnard has maintained a Microsoft Enterprise Agreement (EA) to license the software, cloud services, and infrastructure used across City departments. Microsoft products — including Windows operating systems, Office suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint), SQL Server, and server infrastructure — support day-to-day operations citywide.

The City procures its EA by piggybacking off the County of Riverside's competitively bid Microsoft Enterprise Master Purchase Agreement, shared by more than 900 public agencies. This approach locks in favorable pricing the City could not obtain independently.

The EA provides several key benefits over a three-year term:

- Fixed pricing and amortized licensing costs
- Access to all necessary Microsoft products
- Scalable commitments on hosted services
- Continuous software patches, security updates, and version upgrades under Software Assurance

Each year, the City performs an annual "true-up" to reconcile any product or licensing changes made during the prior twelve months.

The current EA expires April 30, 2026. This renewal covers the period May 1, 2026 through April 30, 2029 and continues citywide Microsoft licensing established under the prior agreement, including Windows desktop and server operating systems, Office suite, SQL Server, Microsoft Systems Center for datacenter management, and professional services. SQL Server licensing allows IT to properly segment database resources and upgrade legacy systems no longer supported on older versions. Systems Center enables IT to manage the City's virtual servers — ensuring they remain current on operating system updates and security patches.

The City continues to evaluate its long-term productivity platform strategy. Several critical departments currently depend on Microsoft software and tools integral to their daily operations. Should the City ultimately determine that a broader migration away from Google Workspace is in its best interest, any such transition would be approached gradually and in a manner that prioritizes continuity of City operations and minimizes disruption to staff. The baseline three-year Microsoft Enterprise Agreement cost is \$936,507 (in equal annual installments of \$312,169), with total costs potentially reaching approximately \$1.36 million over three years if additional users are onboarded and Google Workspace licenses are

correspondingly retired. A 10% contingency of \$136,000 has been included to account for unanticipated licensing needs, integration costs, or data migration expenses, resulting in a total not-to-exceed authorization of \$1.5 million. The City is committed to ensuring that any migration decision is made in a financially responsible manner that carefully balances productivity, operational efficiency, and cost, with the needs of each department thoughtfully considered before any changes are implemented.

At the time of the publication of the agenda, Microsoft was still working on drawing the documents for the agreement. Copies of the agreement will be made available for review upon receiving them.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This agenda item supports the Organizational Effectiveness strategy. The purpose of the Organizational Effectiveness strategy is to reinforce, stabilize, improve, and strengthen the organizational foundation of the City in order to build a modern, high-functioning City government that effectively and efficiently supports the operating departments in providing high-quality services and programs for our residents and businesses.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funding for these services is included in the IT Department's FY 2025–26 budget, and no additional appropriations are required. Future-year funding will be incorporated into upcoming budget processes, with total annual expenditures expected to remain stable and consistent with current levels. Current funding account is 7311801-53001.

COMMITTEE OUTCOME

The Finance & Governance Committee approved 3-0 on April 14, 2026 to approve the staff recommendation and to forward the item for Council approval.
