BACKGROUND

Oxnard City Code section 4-54(B) requires the Purchasing Agent to obtain City Council authorization to sell, rent, destroy, or recycle any single item of the city's personal property that exceeds \$500 in current market value or salvage value that can no longer be used by the city. The Purchasing Division works with City departments to identify the personal property of the City, such as vehicles that, for one reason or another, can no longer be used by the City. Typically, City vehicles and other equipment that can no longer be used are sold at a public auction. For purposes of this report to Council, the Purchasing Division worked with Fleet Services and the Water Divisions of Public Works to identify the surplus property discussed in further detail below that the City can no longer use and/or does not need.

DISCUSSION

The City has 993 vehicles and pieces of heavy equipment valued at approximately \$60.5 million (as of April 2026). The City's vehicle fleet consists of passenger vehicles, light-, medium-, and heavy-duty trucks, refuse and dump trucks, fire apparatus, trailers, and construction equipment. The Fleet Services Division of Public Works is responsible for maintaining and managing the City's vehicle fleet. Periodic review of vehicle condition, operating costs, and mileage is conducted to determine when units should be retired from active service. The vehicles listed in the attached report meet one or more of the following criteria:

- High mileage or engine hours
- Cost-effectiveness of excessive maintenance costs or repeated mechanical failures
- Safety concerns or outdated equipment
- Obsolescence due to technological upgrades

- Regulatory compliance requirements
- End of service life

Over the course of time, vehicles experience increasing maintenance costs and unplanned downtime. Continued operation of these units would require significant investment in repairs that are not cost-effective compared to their remaining service life. This could lead to frequent breakdowns and rising repair costs that exceed replacement thresholds. Auctioning these vehicles is the most efficient and transparent method of disposal. Vehicles are disposed of through an approved public auction vendor to ensure transparency and generate revenue that is deposited back into the general fund or respective department's fund accounts. The auction process is also fully managed by an approved third-party vendor, minimizing staff workload and administrative costs.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This agenda item supports the Organizational Effectiveness strategy. The purpose of the Organizational Effectiveness strategy is to reinforce, stabilize, improve, and strengthen the organizational foundation of the City in order to build a modern, high-functioning City government that effectively and efficiently supports the operating departments in providing high-quality services and programs for our residents and businesses.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Auctioning the surplus vehicles listed in this report is expected to generate revenue, which will be deposited into the general fund or respective department accounts. The estimated revenue is unknown prior to the auction.

Recommendation

That the Finance and Governance Committee recommend the City Council authorize the Purchasing Agent to dispose of 67 units of surplus vehicles, trailers, and related equipment, via public auction. In accordance with City Code Section 4-54(B) items over \$500 require Council authorization for disposal.

Identifying Surplus Assets

- Vehicles, trailers, and related equipment have been identified through City fleet management process
- Surplus items no longer needed or cost-effective to maintain

What's Being Auctioned

- 67 units across Police, Fire, Water, Streets, Parks
- Fleet vehicles, trailers, and operational equipment, including:
 - Sedans, SUVs, pickups, and vans
 - Equipment and utility trailers (including live floor trailers)
 - Service units (flatbeds, box trucks, utility body trucks)
 - Specialized equipment (e.g., striping equipment, pressure washer)
- Model years range from 1987 to 2020
- Assets located across multiple City facilities

Condition of Vehicles and Equipment

- Multiple units exceed 100,000–150,000 miles
- Engine failures, transmission failures, internal damage
- Accident-damaged and part-out vehicles
- Several units non-operational
- Exceeded their useful service life

Examples from Inventory

- 2020 Ford Explorer – accident / part-out
- 2017 Ford Explorer – Transmission failures
- 2007 Ford Explorer – blown motor
- 2017 Ford Ranger – repair cost exceeds value



Evaluation Process

- Fleet Services reviewed all units
- Reassignment considered first
- Lifecycle cost vs. replacement evaluated
- Only non-viable assets designated as surplus

Why Public Auction

- Competitive bidding establishes market value
- Eliminates favoritism or pricing concerns
- Managed by a third-party
- Standardized and defensible disposal method
- Fair and open competition

Financial & Operational Impact

- Avoid continued repair and maintenance costs
- Reduce downtime and liability exposure
- Return revenue to City funds

Recommendation

That the Finance and Governance Committee recommend the City Council authorize the Purchasing Agent to dispose of 67 units of surplus vehicles, trailers, and related equipment, via public auction. In accordance with City Code Section 4-54(B) items over \$500 require Council authorization for disposal.
