Chair Arruejo was absent. Vice Chair Valdes presided and called the meeting to order. BACKGROUND

The City of Oxnard Measure O Half-Cent Sales Tax Citizen Oversight Committee (COC) Guidelines state: “The COC shall select a Chair and Vice Chair from the members, each of whom shall serve a one (1) year term. Elections will be conducted every year.” The duties of the Chair will be to call meetings, set agendas and preside over meetings. The duties of the Vice Chair will be to perform the Chair’s duties in his or her absence. Staff recommends the Committee select a Chair and Vice Chair to serve for the coming year (July 2026 through January 2027).

Each Elected Chair and Vice Chair normally serve for one year (four regular meetings). However, in January 2026 the Citizen Oversight Committee had several open seats that were in the process of being filled. The Committee voted to wait to hold elections until the new members were onboarded and at their first meeting in May. Thus, the currently seated Chair and Vice Chair will continue to fulfill their roles for an additional meeting (May 2026), and the newly elected Chair and Vice Chair will serve at three meetings over their term instead of the standard four.

The Chair and Vice Chair elected for 2026 will serve in that capacity at the July 2026, October 2026 and January 2027 meetings (and any others scheduled in between). At the January 2027 meeting, this item will be presented to the COC again for elections for 2027.

BACKGROUND

This agenda report covers only the projected revenues, expenditures and available fund balance for the Measure O Fund; however, for context, the Citywide proposed budget is approximately \$655.4 million, which includes the landscape maintenance and community facilities district funds, special revenue funds, assessment district funds, enterprise funds, and internal service funds. Anyone can obtain more information about other funds and the rest of the City’s budget recommendation from the Finance and Governance Committee staff report available on the City’s website.

DISCUSSION

The following is information about the FY 2026-27 proposed budget for Measure O. The figures presented are preliminary and may be revised between the publishing of this report and the June 1, 2026, City Council/Housing Authority Board public hearing, as well as at the June 16, 2026, Budget adoption meeting. Significant changes are not anticipated; however, adjustments may be made to reflect the most current available

information.

Measure O Fund Revenues

FY 2026-27 total revenue from the Measure O half-cent sales (transactions and use) tax is proposed at \$20.2 million, a \$0.3 million (1.5%) increase over the FY 2025-26 adopted budget. Sales tax revenue is proposed \$19.5 million, a \$0.3 million (1.8%) increase over the FY 2025-26 adopted budget. Interest income is projected at \$0.68 million, a decrease of \$0.04 million (5.1%) compared to the FY 2025-26 adopted budget.

Measure O Fund Expenditures

FY 2026-27 proposed expenditures are \$19.5 million, a \$9.7 million (33.3%) decrease over the FY 2025-26 adopted budget.

Long term planning must incorporate that the Measure O half-cent sales tax will terminate on March 31, 2029. This Committee recommended on April 28, 2022, and Council adopted on June 7, 2022, a Measure O Weaning Schedule to ensure we are slowly and methodically moving Measure O funded ongoing programs to an alternative source such as the General Fund.

The focus of any new additions to the Measure O Fund is for one-time projects. In FY 2026-27, as previously recommended by this Committee and adopted by Council, staff is weaning \$1.0 million from Measure O to the General Fund. Of this, \$0.4 million relates to the Safe Homes Safe Families and Other Specialized Programs, \$0.2 million for PAL Operational funding, with the remaining \$0.4 million reflecting the East Village Operational Maintenance, College Park and Fire Advanced Life Support programs.

Capital Improvement Projects (CIP)

Public Works staff presented the Five-Year CIP to the Public Works and Transportation Committee on April 28, 2026, and to City Council at their regular meeting on May 19, 2026. Staff is currently recommending funding \$8.2 of CIP projects from the Measure O Fund, and \$9.6 million from the General Fund for FY 2026-27. Staff also recommends the replacement of fire apparatus in amount of \$2.3 million with funding from Measure O Fund. The \$22.5 million is identified in the Mid-Cycle update CIP in the City’s Proposed Budget and includes:

The City Council reviewed the Five-Year CIP plan report on May 19, 2026 and the allocation of funding to specific projects will take place and the public hearing on June 1, 2026 regular meeting.

The City is also proposing one-time operating funding in rent stabilization, senior nutrition, and fire academy, as follows:

Thus, the total impact of all proposed CIP and non-CIP expenditures listed here is \$14,216,022.

Measure O’s current debt service is budgeted at \$3,055,156 and represents approximately 16% of the Measure O Fund proposed expenses. The outstanding debt at the end of FY 2026-27 includes \$4.9 million related to the Fire Station 8 Lease Debt (maturing by December 2031) and another \$3.1 million related to the 2014 Lease Revenue Street Bond (maturing by June 2029).

Measure O Fund Balance

Measure O Fund available fund balance was \$12.8 million as of June 30, 2025. An available fund balance of \$3.6 million is projected for June 30, 2026. The Proposed FY 2026-27 budget revenues of \$20.2 million and expenditures of \$19.5 million result in an increase fund balance of \$0.7 million, leading to an available fund balance of \$4.3 million at the end of FY 2026-27. The projected ending fund balance as of June 30, 2026, along with the Weaning Schedule, is adequate to support paying down debt in future years and supporting one-time projects until Measure O sunsets in FY 2028-29.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This agenda item supports the Economic Development strategy. The purpose of the Economic Development strategy is to focus on the retention and expansion of Oxnard businesses by increasing the skills and employability of our local workforce, invite new business investments, and target site-based redevelopment opportunities.

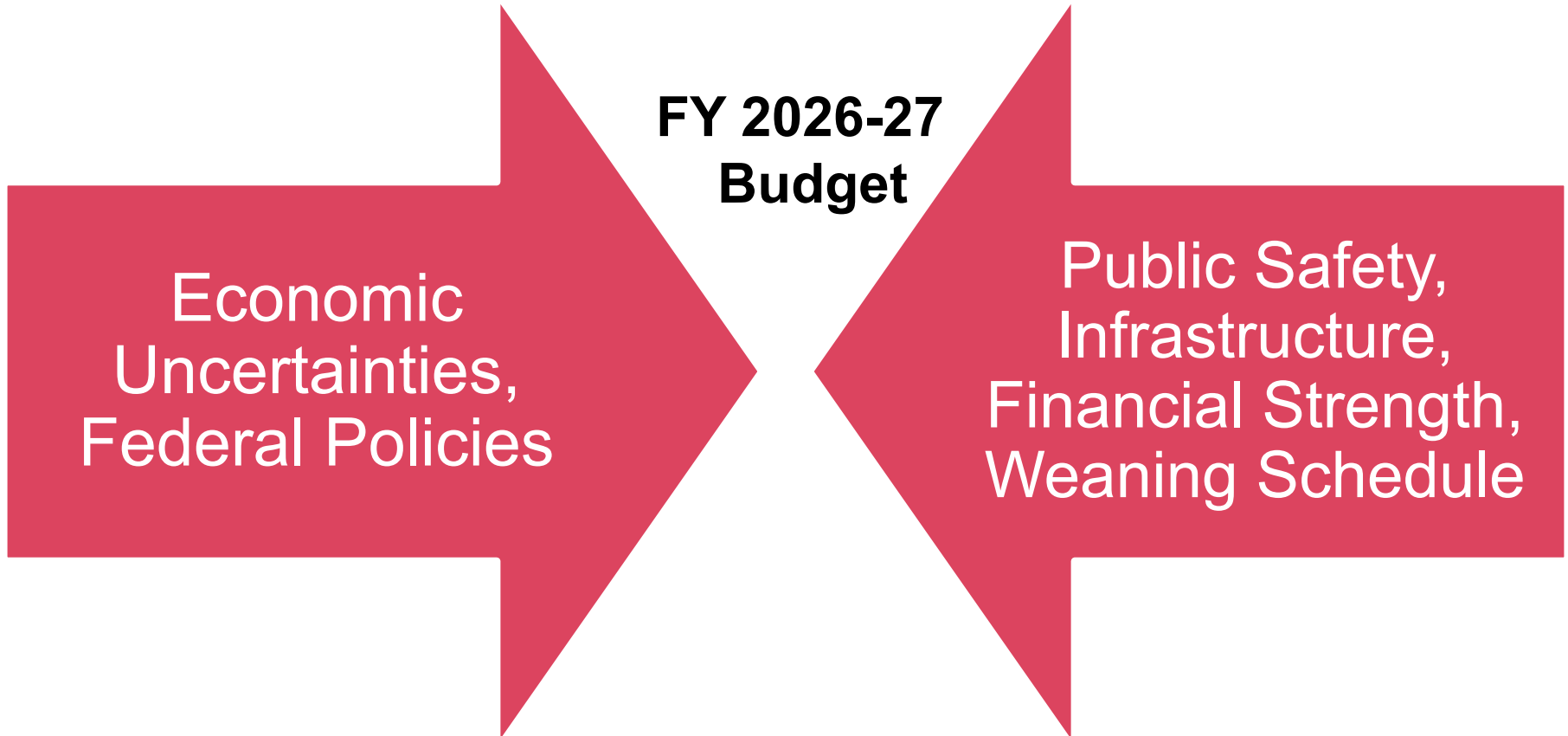

BACKGROUND

On May 5, 2026, Macias, Gini and O’Connell (MGO) presented the audited financial statements for FY 2024-25 to the Finance and Governance Committee, and were scheduled to present at the May 19, 2026 City Council. Prior to that meeting, MGO requested to recall their independent auditor reports until further evaluation could be conducted into comments made to them by City Treasurer Phillip Molina.

Included in the City’s financial statements are statements presenting the balance sheet, statement of revenues and expenditures, and changes in fund balance of the Measure O fund. Ordinance 2779, which sets forth the parameters of Measure O as adopted by the voters in 2008, requires: “The amount generated by this new general-purpose revenue source and how the revenues were used shall be included in the annual audit of the City’s financial operations by an independent certified public accountant”. Given MGO’s pause on the audit, the financial statements for FY 2024-25 currently do not have an opinion from the City auditors (MGO).

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This agenda item supports the Organizational Effectiveness strategy. The purpose of the Organizational Effectiveness strategy is to reinforce, stabilize, improve, and strengthen the organizational foundation of the City in order to build a modern, high-functioning City government that effectively and efficiently supports the operating departments in providing high-quality services and programs for our residents and businesses.
