SUBJECT: Authorization to Submit Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Grant Applications.

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council adopt a resolution that:

1. Ratifies the submission of three (3) grant applications to FEMA for Fiscal Year 2025 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program in the amount of \$1,908,421.72 in grant funding, including a \$173,492.89 local match requirement, for the purpose of acquiring twenty-one (21) self-contained breathing apparatus and conducting paramedic and urban search and rescue training for Oxnard Fire personnel.
2. Ratifies the submission of one (1) grant application to FEMA for a Fiscal Year 2025 Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) grant in the amount of \$211,406.64, including a \$10,066.98 local match requirement, for the installation of 2,500 smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and fifteen (15) smoke detectors for the deaf and hearing impaired;
3. Authorizes the City Manager or designee to execute the grant agreements if grant funds are awarded to the City;
4. Authorizes the Chief Financial Officer or designee to submit financial reports and grant claims for the use of match and grant funds and perform all other required financial actions; and
5. Authorizes the Fire Chief or designee to submit non-financial reports.
