A. ROLL CALL / POSTING OF AGENDA Quorum

Vanessa Hernandez, the new chair of Fremont North, introduced Vice Chair Lorrie Barry, and her Secretary/ Treasurer Terri Gonzales.

B. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

C. APPROVAL OF MINUTES Minutes of June 1, 2016.

Jack Villa made a motion to approve the minutes of June 1, 2016 as amended. Len Shulman seconded. The motion passed.

D. GUEST SPEAKER

1. Presentation on the Oxnard 311 app. (R. Voll) Rhea Voll gave an overview of the 311 mobile application. She indicated that the app can be accessed from the City website and directly on a cell phone through the play store on android or the app store on apple. She noted that the 311 app can be used by residents to make and track service requests and that it automatically translates for Spanish speakers. She stated that the app also has analytical tools that allow staff to determine its effectiveness. A question and answer session followed.

E. PUBLIC COMMENTS Public Comments were taken from Nancy Rahn, Abel Magana, Miguel Lopez and Daniel Chavez.

F. NEIGHBORHOOD CHAIR REPORTS

Vanessa Hernandez, Fremont North: Reactivated after 5 years. Cleanup on July 16. Meeting on July 9 in Eastwood Park. AYSO soccer is overcrowding the streets. She spoke about the traffic problems with AYSO soccer in her neighborhood. She thanked Joe Avelar for his help.

Alice Madrid, Bartolo Square North: Cleanup on June 11. Thanks to Rebecca Guevara for her help. Requested food share donations from cleanup participants

Joe Avelar, Lemonwood Eastmont: Spoke about fireworks problems. He has not been able to get people to run for neighborhood council, or to help out with cleanups. Had meeting with City attorney regarding oil in park. The issue has not been resolved yet.

Nancy Rahn, Blackstock North: Thanked people who helped get people to voting polls. She noted that the City phone numbers listed in the weekly packet are very useful.

Dale Dean, Cabrillo: Cleanup on July 19th. Thanked Environmental Resources for helping to set up cleanups.

Michael Gleason, West Village: Election meeting in September. June 22nd had block party to strengthen neighborhood watch. Thanks to Officer Richard Tuten for his help. Cleanup on July 9th. Spoke about his continuing efforts with Landscape Maintenance Districts.

Carlos Quiroz, Redwood Sunkist: Thanked Rebecca Guevara for her help with cleanup and some illegal dumping in his alleyway. Spoke about illegal penalties for illegal dumping and the fireworks problem. He believes the City Council needs to pay closer attention to the problems in the City.

Patricia Tom, Hobson Park West: Thanked Rebecca Guevara for her help. Loves the Oxnard 311 app. She agreed with the previous complaints about fireworks. Cleanup will be in August and the election meeting will be later in September. Spoke about the ongoing parking problems in her neighborhood.

Steve Fleischer, Hobson Park East: Spoke about the fireworks problem.

Pat Brown, Five Points NE: Spoke about the fireworks problem and the tot lot at the apartment complex development at former drive in.

Aaron Greer, Windsor North: Spoke about landscape maintenance district in his neighborhood. Neighborhood cleanup on August 20th. Meeting on July 14th. Spoke about the increase of fireworks/explosives.

Julie Pena, Oxnard Shores: Spoke about how well the police monitored the fireworks at the beach, and the Parks Departments removal of sand and the cleaning of the parks by the beach.

Jackie Tedeschi, Southbank: Spoke about June 23rd meeting. Guests were Kathleen Mallory and Tony Telemonte. The topic was The Village at Wagon Wheel. New beat officer is Officer Joe Bentley. Thanked 2015 Southbank executive board. Mr. Tolien is new member at large. Cleanup is September 17th.

Jack Villa, Hobson Park East: Thanked officer Crystal Walker and Assistant Police Chief Jason Benites for their Neighborhood Watch presentation. Thanked Patricia Tom for attending and for the efforts of the two neighborhoods to work together.

Len Shulman, Carriage Square: Spoke about fireworks problem. Next Door is up to 201 members. Asked Rebecca Guevara from Environmental Resources to introduce herself. Rebecca Guevara introduced herself and her supervisor James Torrez. Her contact number is: 385-8226

G. EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORTS

Jack Villa Reported on Communications Committee - Fremont North has been started. They will try to activate Bartolo Square South next. Pleasant Valley Estates will have an election meeting on July 14th.

Jackie Tedeschi Reminded everyone that Sharon Aranda needs the original sign in sheets from election meetings. Sharon also needs the names, and contact information of all elected council members.

Julie Pena Thanked Miguel Lopez, Daniel Chavez and Rebecca Guevera for attending the meeting. Noted that the Oxnard Shores cleanup went very smoothly.

Jackie Tedeschi Verified with Rebecca Guevera that Environmental Resources was handling the flyers for the neighborhood cleanups.

Len Shulman Reported that the INCO 2nd Annual Town Hall meeting will be held on Wednesday, September the 7th, in the Oxnard Room at the Performing Arts Center. Mayor Flynn will give a presentation on the State of the City after which the Mayor and City Manager Greg Nyhoff will be on hand to answer questions. There will be two candidate debates with David Marin acting as the moderator. The city council debate will be Monday, October 10th and the mayoral debate will be held on Monday, October 17th. Both will be held in the main auditorium of the Performing Arts Center. There are 1600 seats available. Events are all free. The INCO will also have a booth at the Multicultural Festival on October 1st.

J. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Pat Brown Indicated that Neighborhood Services is moving towards going paperless and will eventually not provide any printed materials. She noted that if this occurs she will have to purchase the materials because she doesn't have internet access or e-mail. She stated that there are other poor neighborhoods that will have a similar problem.

Len Shulman: Stated that it would be worked out and that nobody will be left out.

Joe Avelar Illegal car washing is still a problem. Would like someone from the State to come and speak about the issue. He believes the INCO needs to press the issue.

Nancy Rahn Agreed with Mr. Avelar about car washing. Noted that October 10th is Columbus Day, which is a Federal Holiday.
