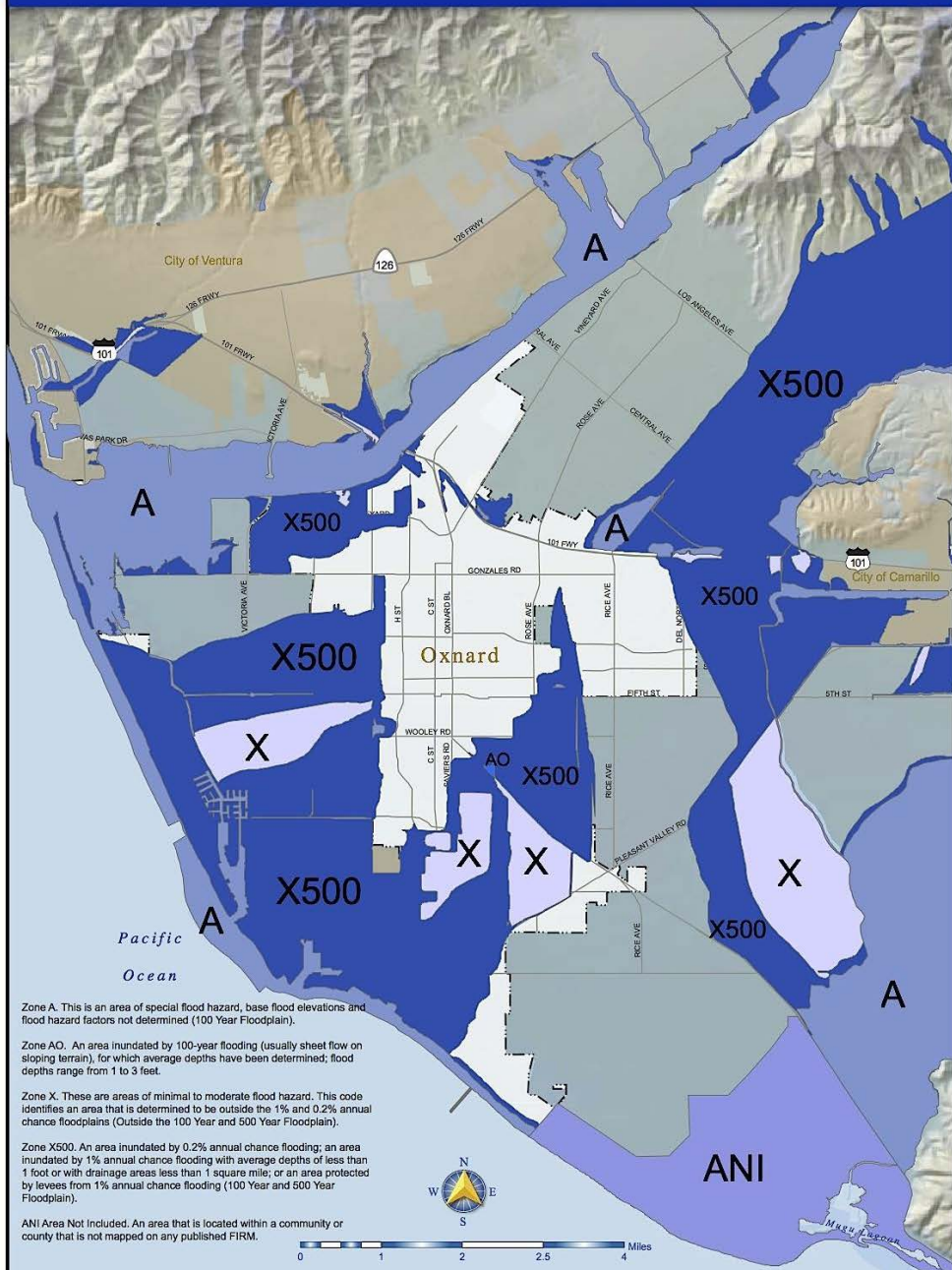
Local disasters will have immediate and long term impacts if communities are unprepared. It is therefore fitting that we focus our energies on improving our local communities' resilience to natural hazards.

- Tsunami

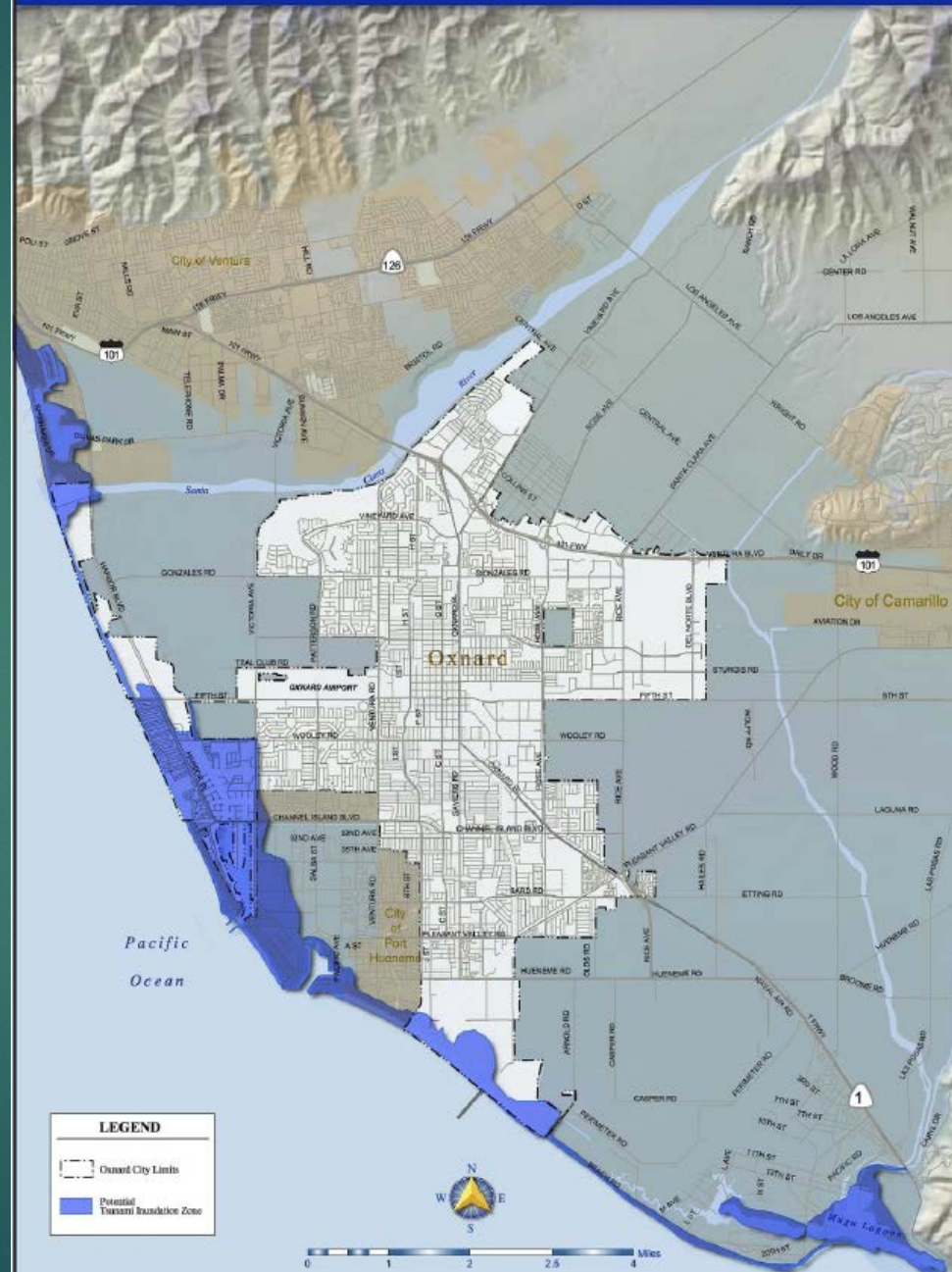


Flood Zones
