We made Survey to know what were the real needs of the community of Southwinds

- **We worked on the surveys in front of Art Haycox Elementary in the end of the school year of 2015 and during the summer in Southwinds park. While PAL was giving lunch to the community.**

Surveys Results

- **81% reported wanting to have better lights in the bathroom,**
- **85% people want to have doors in the bathrooms,**
- **Nearly 70% want to have recycling,**
- **Nearly 8 in 10 (or 78.7%) report wanting a Non-smoking ordinance with a fee for violators,**
- **Over 90% (91.6%) want cleaner bathrooms,**
- **AN overwhelming 88% want to feel safer,**
- **Nearly half of the people who took our survey (48%) want the trees to be trimmed,**
- **And over 92% want the police to do more surveillance.**

Goals for the Southwinds Community:

Teach them:

- How to lead a legislative meetings
- How to speak in Public
- How to make Surveys
- Most importantly show them how important it is for them to speak up for their community.

The bathrooms had no doors. The lights were old and really dim. The water fountain was dry and broken. Sadly being the only fountain in the park.

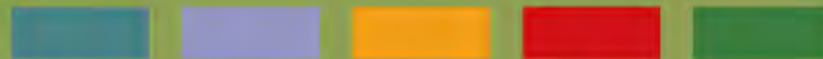

RECREATIONAL VENUES

What are the measures?

The measures are the number of acres in East County and West County devoted to parks and open space, and the proportion of the county's land reserved for parks and open space, compared to other areas of Southern California.

Why are the measures important?

Parks and open space are important to any region's quality of life. They provide places to hike, golf, picnic, and just relax and enjoy nature. They give wild animals the space they need to roam, and they help the environment by protecting air, water and soil from the effects of urbanization. Recreational venues also give Ventura County some of its distinctive character, splitting the area's sprawl into distinct cities with greenbelts in between.

How are we doing?

How Ventura County ranks in providing parks and open space depends on how one counts the massive Los Padres National Forest. The Los Padres National Forest takes up nearly

the entire northern half of Ventura County. Include that land, and West Ventura County is more than half parks and open space, at 56.6 percent. The Los Padres National Forest is a valuable and beautiful asset, but the forest is far from any major centers, and much of it is inaccessible to all but the hardest wilderness travelers. If it is excluded from the calculations, West Ventura County's land is only 1.9 percent parks and open space, the lowest figure of any area in Southern California.

East Ventura County has no comparably large national forest, though it does have the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area. When national forests aren't included, East Ventura County is 7.8 percent parks and open space, which is a little above the overall rate in Southern California. Include national forests, and the East County is 26.6 percent parks and open space, well below the regional total of 46.3 percent.

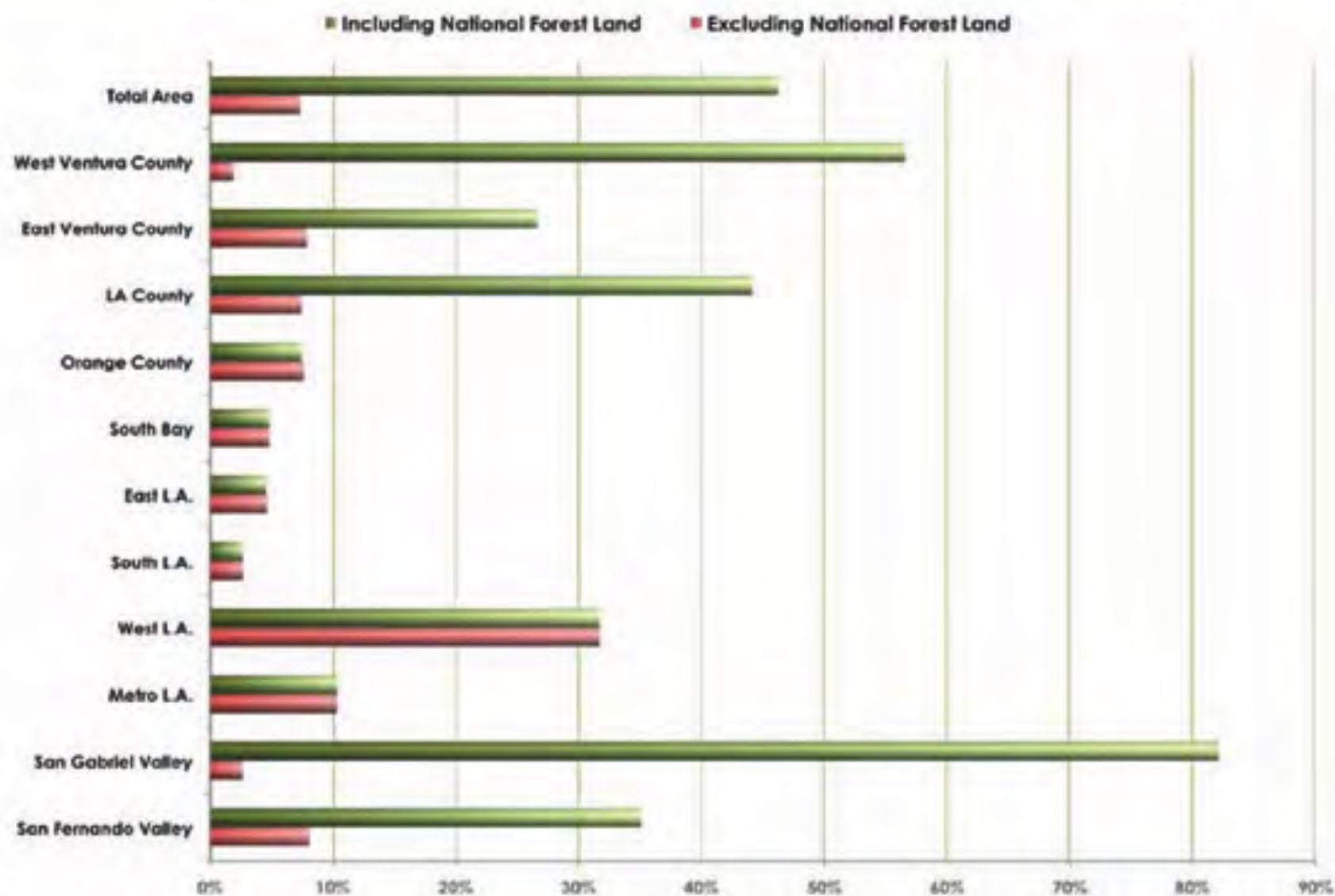


ACRES OF RECREATIONAL VENUES AS PERCENT OF TOTAL ACRES (2004)

-Having part of a structure dedicated to children who may not be wheelchair-bound is an important part of an inclusive playground. It provides a space for children to challenge themselves and also enables parents to more easily bring the entire family to the playground.

Rhapsody Music Equipment

-Height of equipment allows for children or adults in wheelchair or other mobility devices to maneuver directly under equipment.
-Provides Auditory and Tactile Stimulation.
-Encourages social and imaginative skills that result in healthy engagement.

Slides

-Provide Vestibular, tactile and proprioceptive stimulation.
-Rollerslide – Great for children with cochlear implants. Eliminates static electricity.
-Double Swoosh Slide – Allows for caretaker to ride along with child who may be scared.

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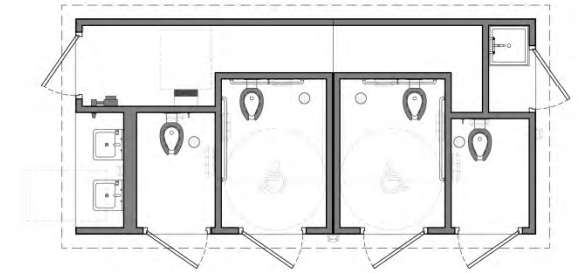












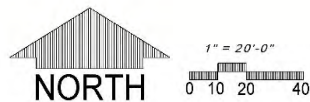
FLOOR PLAN

Community Garden

The mission of the Dr. Manuel M. Lopez community garden is to beautify Oxnard through transforming vacant lots into gardens where young and old can come together to enjoy public green space, share cultural traditions, and learn to grow their own food.
