BACKGROUND

The City Council adopted the following resolutions in preparation for the November 6, 2018 General Election:

- Resolution No. 15,104 (April 3, 2018) – reducing the maximum special tax in Seabridge CFD-4 (“Measure F”),
- Resolution No. 15,134 (June 5, 2018) – imposing a Cannabis Business Tax (“Measure G”),
- Resolution No. 15,136 (June 12, 2018) – calling the election of the Mayor and City Council Districts 1, 2, 5, and 6, and consolidating the election with the County of Ventura,
- Resolution No. 15,138 (June 12, 2018) – reducing the special tax for overhead charges in Seabridge CFD-3 (“Measure H”)
- Resolution No. 15,139 (June 12, 2018) – reducing the harbor patrol special tax in Seabridge CFD-4 (“Measure I”)

The final vote shows that Tim Flynn was the successful candidate for Mayor, Bert E. Perello for Council District 1, Carmen Ramirez for Council District 2, Gabriela Basua for Council District 5, and Vianey Lucia Lopez for Council District 6. Ballot measures F, G, H, and I were each approved by the requisite majority of votes cast.

The County Clerk certified the election on December 3, 2018 and the Board of Supervisors is anticipated to declare the results at its December 11, 2018 meeting.

The Certificates of Election Results and the Statements of Votes by precinct are attached to the proposed resolution.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

This agenda item is a routine operational item that does not directly relate to the four strategic priorities adopted by City Council on May 17, 2016.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Adoption of the resolution carries no fiscal impact. Final costs for the General Election have not yet been fully calculated.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Oxnard called for a general municipal election in the City of Oxnard on November 6, 2018, to elect a Mayor for a term of two years, a Councilmember for Council District 1 for a term of four years, a Councilmember for Council District 2 for a term of four years, a Councilmember for Council District 5 for a term of four years, and a Councilmember for Council District 6 for a term of two years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Oxnard called for an election of four ballot measures (Measures F, G, H, and I) for the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was duly given in the time, form, and manner provided by law, and the election was held on the above date, and the votes cast were canvassed and the returns thereof made at the time and in the manner and form provided by law; and

WHEREAS, on this 11th day of December, 2018, the City Council duly assembled at its usual place of meeting and received the certification of the election from the County Clerk.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Oxnard does hereby resolve:

1. That a general municipal election was held on November 6, 2018, that the votes cast were duly canvassed, and that the returns were made at the time, in the form and in the manner required by law.

2. That the Vote By Mail ballots were canvassed and counted as required by law.

3. That this City Council has reviewed the canvass of the returns of the election and from the returns it appears, and this City Council finds that the whole number of votes cast in the City in the election, the names of the persons voted for and for what office each person was voted for, the number of votes cast at each precinct at the election and for each person, the total number of votes given in the City to each person, and the total number of votes given to each measure, are as shown on Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

4. That Tim Flynn received the highest number of votes for the office of Mayor and is hereby declared to be elected.

5. That Bert E. Perello received the highest number of votes for the office of Councilmember for Council District 1 and is hereby declared to be elected.

6. That Carmen Ramirez received the highest number of votes for the office of Councilmember for Council District 2 and is hereby declared to be elected.

7 That Gabriela Basua received the highest number of votes for the office of Councilmember for Council District 5 and is hereby declared to be elected.

8. That Vianey Lucia Lopez received the highest number of votes for the office of Councilmember for Council District 6 and is hereby declared to be elected.

9. That more than 50% of the votes cast for Measure F were in favor of the measure and it is hereby declared to be passed.

10. That more than 50% of the votes cast for Measure G were in favor of the measure and it is hereby declared to be passed.

11. That more than 50% of the votes cast for Measure H were in favor of the measure and it is hereby declared to be passed.

12. That more than 50% of the votes cast for Measure I were in favor of the measure and it is hereby declared to be passed.

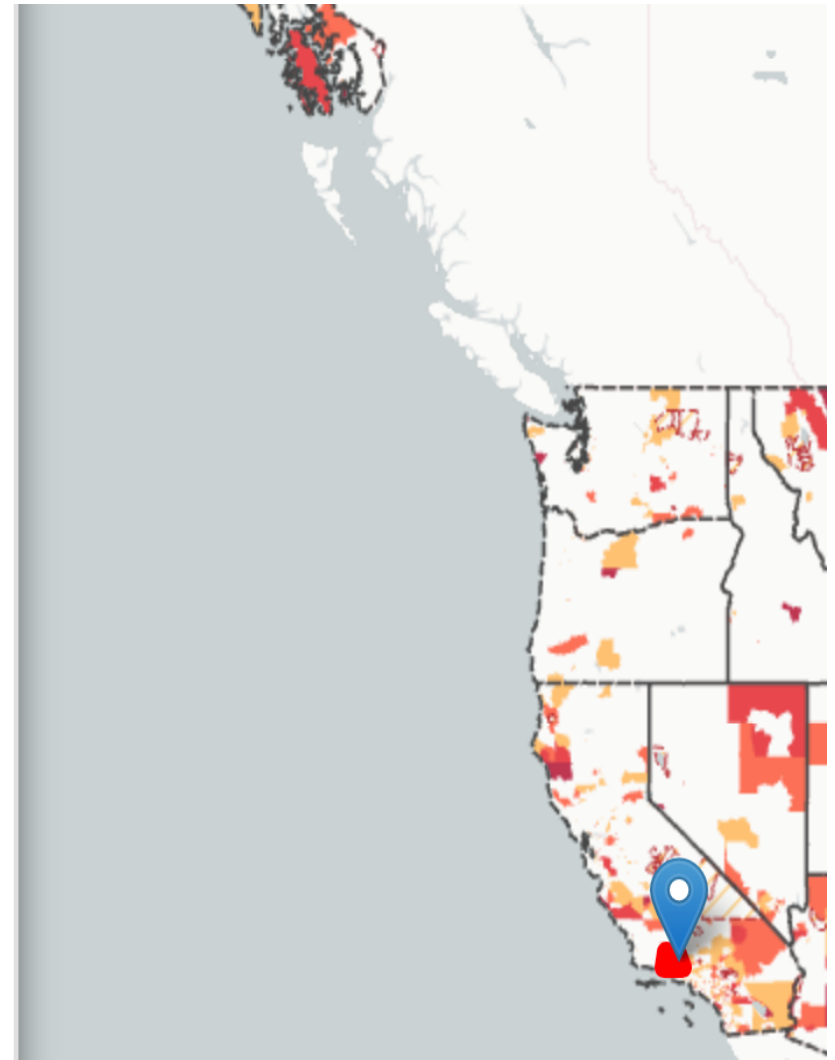

BACKGROUND

California Government Code sections 34905 and 36801 provide that the city council, at the meeting at which the declaration of the election results for a general municipal election is made, shall choose a mayor pro tem from among its members.

The city council may choose from a couple of common methods to make its selection. One way to choose would be to open the floor to nominations and take a vote once all nominations have been made. Any member can make a nomination, and may nominate him/herself. A majority vote of members present is required to make the selection.

Another common method of selection is to appoint the mayor pro tem from among the councilmembers in order of seniority.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

This agenda item is a routine operational item that does not directly relate to the four strategic priorities adopted by City Council on May 17, 2016.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council adopt a resolution regarding its intention to continue its practice of governing with a citywide perspective following the shift to district-based elections.

DISCUSSION

After the City received a notice alleging violation of the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) in October 2017, the City Council, to avoid costly litigation, adopted a resolution of intent in November 2017 to transition to district-based Council elections. Following numerous public hearings from December 2017 to February 2018, the Council adopted an ordinance in March 2018 approving a map of six Council districts (adding two more seats to the five-member body) and declaring the November 2018 General Election to be the first district-based election in the City of Oxnard.

The final results of the General Election saw the re-election of three incumbents along with welcoming two newcomers to the City Council. As each Councilmember resides in one of the defined districts of the City of Oxnard, the City Council now has representation from throughout the City, with the office of Mayor continuing to be elected at-large.

A concern that some have expressed over the transition to Council districts, however, is that a political “silo effect” might result – that councilmembers elected on a district basis will care primarily about projects and issues that affect their district, with less concern about the problems

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or needs of other parts of the City. The intent of creating CVRA-compliant districts was never to factionalize the public's interests or create conflict between or among different geographic areas of the City, but to remove any "(potential impairments to) the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election," per the CVRA. The hope is that the by-district transition would instead be a unifying experience for Oxnard residents, preserving a citywide sense of purpose and cooperation.

With that in mind, it would be in everyone's best interest for the City Council to maintain the principle that the City as a whole remains the first responsibility of all elected officials: all members of the City Council will continue to serve all of the people of Oxnard. The City Council will continue to govern with an at-large perspective, considering the needs and interests of the entire community and remaining united in its service to all residents. Any member of the City Council should be willing to help anyone in the community who calls or contacts them, regardless of their district of residence.

The Council may also wish to reaffirm that constituents and Councilmembers can both contact the City Manager for assistance with an issue. Just as a constituent may contact any of the members of the City Council to express their concern or to have an issue addressed, the City Manager's office can always be contacted to help with an issue, as is done currently. The City Council will continue to work through the City Manager to address issues not only within their district, but citywide.

Similarly, resource allocations should be based on the professional recommendations of staff and the highest and best need as measured citywide. There shall not be district-by-district plans, resource allocations, staffing models, or capital investment. Having such would lead to weakened governance, increased inefficiencies, and spending of resources on something other than the highest and best use. Rather, Oxnard, in its Council/Manager form of government, utilizes professional managers to evaluate the best use and allocation of limited available resources to deliver services based on needs, customer focus, long-range plans, being informed of issues in all districts, data, and what makes the most sense economically.

For the first time, Oxnard is navigating Council districts along with dozens of other California cities that have made the transition recently. This new era is an exciting opportunity to govern with a community-wide approach anew. The City of Oxnard has grown and thrived throughout its 115-year history because it operates as a single entity serving the population as a whole; therefore continuing this focus will bring benefits for all Oxnard residents now and into the future.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This agenda item, in an indirect way, supports all of the Council's Strategic Priorities by affirming the Council's commitment to serving the citizens as a whole, rather than by electoral boundaries.

2. The City Council affirms that constituents and Councilmembers can both contact the City Manager for assistance with an issue. Just as a constituent may contact any of the members of the City Council to express their concern or to have an issue addressed, the City Manager's office can always be contacted to help with an issue, as is done currently. Similarly, the City Council will continue to work through the City Manager to address issues not only within their district, but citywide; and
3. Resource allocations should be based on the professional recommendations of staff and the highest and best need as measured citywide. A. ROLL CALL/POSTING OF AGENDA

At 6:09 p.m., Mayor Flynn called to order the regular meeting of the Oxnard City Council in the City Hall Council Chambers, 305 W. Third Street, Oxnard, California. Councilmembers Bryan A. MacDonald, Oscar Madrigal, Bert Perello, Mayor Pro Tem Carmen Ramirez, and Mayor Tim Flynn were present.

RECOMMENDATION:

That City Council appropriate \$61,728.21 from the CUPA Capital Equipment Fund 373 fund balance for the purchase and outfitting of one vehicle for the Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) inspectors.

BACKGROUND

Californians are protected from hazardous waste and materials by a Unified Program that ensures consistency throughout the state in regard to administrative requirements, permits, inspections, and enforcement. CalEPA oversees the program as a whole, and certifies 83 local government agencies known as Certified Unified Program Agencies (CUPA) to implement the hazardous waste and materials standards set by five different state agencies. The Oxnard Fire Department is the local administrator for the CUPA program that conducts inspections and provides oversight for businesses that store hazardous materials and generates hazardous waste.

Through the administration of requirements, permits, inspections and enforcement processes, revenue is generated from penalties, fines or from legal action. These funds are regulated by the State of California and can be spent on equipment and training for program activities.

The CUPA division is composed of four inspectors, support staff, and a division manager. The division maintains a 24/7 emergency response capability to mitigate hazardous materials

incidents, with one inspector on standby after hours and on weekends on a rotating basis. For larger or more complicated incidents, the division manager also responds. The assigned vehicle for the CUPA manager failed earlier this year after 14 years of service and 126,000 miles. Replacement of the vehicle is therefore necessary to maintain division operations. The use of the CUPA funds for the purchase of the vehicle is an allowable expense per California Health and Safety Code 25404.1.1(i):

All administrative penalties collected from actions brought by a UPA pursuant to this section shall be paid to the UPA that imposed the penalty, and shall be deposited into a special account that shall be expended to fund the activities of the UPA in enforcing this chapter.

CUPA has worked with Fleet Services to select a 2019 Chevrolet Silverado 1500, **which is available under the Sourcewell (Formerly known as NJPA) master vehicle contract.** The vehicle that will be purchased is a stock vehicle and will require some additional outfitting of fire radios and miscellaneous emergency response equipment. The cost is \$37,558 for the vehicle and camper shell, plus \$16,382 to equip the vehicle with instrumentation console, lights, and a slide-out cargo vault mounted in the truck bed, and \$3,318 to equip with mobile radio. With tax, fees and delivery, the total comes to \$61,728.21.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This agenda item is a routine operational item or does not relate to the four strategic plans adopted by City Council on May 17, 2016.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funding in the amount of \$61,728.21 is available from CUPA Capital Program Fund Balance for the purchase of one replacement vehicle for CUPA division manager. With this recommendation, the FY 2019 estimated unreserved fund balance for CUPA Capital Program Fund 373 is \$232,000.

Enforcement Trust Fund Account Policy and Guidelines

March 2010

“The Fund serves to foster and assist the City of Oxnard Fire Department Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) in program development, training, and other program functions”.

1. PURPOSE OF GUIDELINES

- 1.1. Creation of Trust Account.** The Oxnard Fire Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) (OFD) hereby establishes the Enforcement Trust Account to be administered by the OFD.
- 1.2. Purpose of Guidelines.** These Fund Guidelines govern management of the Enforcement Trust Account Fund for expenditures outlines below.
- 1.3. Authority.** Administrative Enforcement Order (AEO) Authority and issuance of administrative penalties and establishment of a special account. California Health & Safety code, Section 25404.1.1 (i) and 25187 (a) and (k).

2. OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSES

- 2.1 General and Specific Purposes.** This Trust Account has been organized solely and exclusively for the purpose of CUPA program development and specific program functions.

3. **TRUST FUND**

3.1 Definition. The Fund is established to disburse and manage monies obtained from AEO case settlements and other state-wide enforcement cases.

3.2 Fund. The Fund shall be held exclusively by an account established by the OFD CUPA and managed by the CUPA Coordinator. The Fund shall also include all interest derived from monies in the Fund.

- 4. EXPENDITURES FROM THE TRUST FUND** Proposed expenditures shall be authorized and approved by the CUPA Coordinator. The following is a list of examples of qualified expenditures:

Qualified Expenditure	Examples
Enhancement in data management hardware, contract services, and/or enforcement capabilities	Laptop, field tablets, scanners, software, and contract services to convert from paper to electronic (scanning and data entry), purchase of applicable software for electronic data management.
Specific database applications	Statewide training database
Field instrument for hazardous materials applications, hazardous materials applications, investigations, and enforcement	IR's, CGI's, PID's, gas meters, TLV's or other equipment that will assist inspectors/emergency responders in evaluating field situations.
Training	Travel and other related expenses for staff training.
Enforcement investigations/case development	Case specific such as sample collection, and laboratory analysis
Other equipment to support the CUPA program	Vehicles, PPE, and others
Training assistance, projects or efforts with other Division/departments to enhance interagency cooperation	Travel and other related expenses for Fire Prevention and other departments such as wastewater and environmental services (assist in obtaining scholarships).
Consultants	Develop program related projects

5. MISCELLANEOUS

5.1 Expenses of Administration All expenses incurred in the administration of the Fund shall be paid from the Fund.

6. RECORDS AND FILES The CUPA Coordinator shall maintain a copy of all expenditure records, receipts, correspondence, and any other records and files related to the Fund. All records shall be maintained indefinitely.

RECOMMENDATION:

That City Council:

1. Establish five new personnel classifications to support and accurately reflect the necessary work by staff in the Temporary Emergency Shelter; and
2. Adopt a Resolution amending Resolution No. 15,153, pursuant to Chapter 4 of the City Personnel Rules and Regulations, incorporating the five new classifications and the salary ranges for each.

BACKGROUND

In recent months, the cities of Oxnard and Ventura, together with the County of Ventura, have undertaken several joint actions to address the crisis of homelessness in western Ventura County. In June, both cities authorized efforts to find appropriate sites to establish year-round, 24-hour shelters, one in each City, with the County committing significant resources to the two cities to help realize that goal. As part of that partnership, a Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued seeking firms to operate those year-round shelters.

The City Council adopted a Declaration of Shelter Crisis on September 18, 2018, and both the City of Ventura and the County of Ventura followed suit one week later. Given that the planned year-round shelters are not yet open, the partnership sought to address the need for temporary shelter during the upcoming months of colder weather. On October 16, 2018, Council authorized the establishment of a 24-hour Temporary Emergency Shelter (TES) for homeless individuals, to operate at the site of the former National Guard Armory in Oxnard, with a target

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opening date in December 2018, through no later than June 1, 2019. Council also appropriated \$200,000 for the TES, which is being supplemented by a matching \$200,000 from the City of Ventura and an additional \$185,000 from the County of Ventura, and authorized the City Manager to execute the necessary agreements for the establishment and operation of the TES.

As reported to Council at the meeting of October 16, 2018, the Mercy House organization was selected to operate the year-round shelter, and negotiations have begun on a formal agreement for that purpose. However, Mercy House indicated that they are not in a position to undertake the operation of a temporary shelter. On November 1, 2018, the non-profit Downtown Ventura Organization (DVO), acting as fiscal agent for the regional partnership, issued a formal solicitation for organizations to operate the TES, via publication of a Request for Letters of Interest and Statement of Qualifications (RFLISQ), with a due date of November 19th for responses to that solicitation.

Unfortunately, to date no organizations – for-profit, non-profit, faith-based, or any others – have responded to the RFLISQ. In light of the looming possibility of having no emergency shelter in place this winter, the City developed a plan to hire temporary staff and directly operate the TES.

While the City has for many years supported sheltering activities, the City has always done so by contracting with a third-party shelter operator. Because there are no City job classifications applicable to homeless shelter operations, The Housing and Human Resources Departments developed position descriptions and begin recruitment for the necessary staff to work in the TES.

The following five new classifications have been created:

1. Shelter Manager
2. Shelter Supervisor
3. Shelter Monitor
4. Shelter Navigator
5. Shelter Intake Worker

These positions are all temporary full-time “Extra Help” positions, and as such are limited to 960 hours of employment. These new hires will not be eligible for any additional benefits beyond what is required for temporary employees by applicable state and federal law. Upon employment, these shelter staff will work under the supervision of the Housing Department, with two staff from that Department taking the lead in overseeing the TES operation.

Recruitment was initiated on November 28, 2018, but hiring of staff cannot occur without City Council approval of the creation of these five new classifications, and the adoption of the attached Resolution amending the City’s schedule of classifications. The appropriate bargaining unit representatives have been advised of this action, and have no objections.

This agenda item supports the Quality of Life strategy. The purpose of the Quality of Life strategy is to build relationships and create opportunities within the community for safe and vibrant neighborhoods, which will showcase the promising future of Oxnard. This item supports the following goals and objectives:

Goal 2. Address homelessness through the development and implementation of a multi-tiered strategy.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The personnel costs associated with the creation and hiring of these new positions are covered by the \$200,000 Measure “O” funded Homeless Program (MO5101), approved by Council on October 16, 2018 towards operational costs of the TES. Staff anticipates that combined with the additional \$385,000 contributions from the City of Ventura and the County of Ventura, there would sufficient funds to cover the personnel costs and other operational costs of the program. Staff plans to return to City Council in February of 2019 with updated plan and revised cost estimates.
